These marks acknowledge the Opposition's commitment to partnering with local government. Their commitment to increasing FA Grants, to including local government in National Cabinet, their Housing Australia Future Fund, and commitments regarding disaster preparedness, address a number of key concerns for local government. There is no commitment to the LRCIP at this point, however, the LGAQ is optimistic that the ALP's overall mark will increase as announcements are made in the campaign.



These marks acknowledge the LNP government's commitment to improving digital connectivity, to water infrastructure in Queensland, and to extending the LRCIP. However, the party's score has been detrimentally effected by the reduction in the FA Grant funding (down to 0.55% from 0.6% of Federal tax revenue) and a reduction in the LRCIP amount. Based on the LNP's initial response, the LGAQ anticipates the party's mark will improve as the party releases more of its election commitments.



After initial communications, the LGAQ was encouraged by The Green's openness to considering our 2022 election priorities. The Party has formally responded to our requests with their policy positions. Some of these are very supportive of local government, while there has been no direct response to other requests. As such, the LGAQ is unable to allocate a higher mark to The Greens at this time.



One Nation has not responded to the LGAQ's requests to meet to discuss local government priorities for the 2022 Federal Election, nor have they provided us with any formal response indicating support for them. We have based this score on what we have been able to discern from their policy positions.
