This slight increase in the ALP mark acknowledges the Opposition's announcements on housing and disaster preparedness. The LGAQ is looking for more detail on the commitment to increase FA Grants and the vital LRCI Program, councils are hopeful that the ALP will make further announcements to address the key concerns of local government.

This mark acknowledges the local commitments that the LNP government has made during the campaign in some local communities. However, the party's score can only improve if announcements regarding key concerns of councils are addressed and this has been lacking in the campaign so far.

While we welcome the deep commitment to improving environment and local manufacturing, councils are disappointed that the Greens haven't made specific commitments to address the key concerns of local communities including on increasing FA Grants and making the LRCIP permanent.

One Nation has still not responded to the LGAQ's requests to meet to discuss local government priorities for the 2022 Federal election, nor have they provided us with any formal response indicating support for them. We therefore can't increase this score.
